

Daily life

- Is your weekday routine different from your weekend routine? (In what ways?)
- What do you look forward to at the end of the day?
- Do you watch television every day? (How much television do you watch?)

Work and education

- Do you think you will use English a lot in the future? (In what ways?)
- Do you prefer working on your own or with other people? (Why?)
- Is there something new you'd really like to learn about? (Why?)
- Are you happier doing mental or physical work? (Why?)

Travel

- What's your favourite way of travelling? (Why do you like it?)
- What's the longest journey you've ever been on? (Tell us about it)
- How do you pass the time on a long journey?
- Where did you spend your most interesting holiday?..... (What did you do?)

TASK 2.2B

ATTITUDES D2

Interlocutor

The photos show different attitudes towards the current social situation.

First, talk to each other about the different scenes. Then decide which is the most appropriate one to express an opinion about something.

If candidates do not use all the time assigned for this task, the examiner may use these prompts to encourage further discussion.

- Do you think society achieves anything by demonstrating?
- Have you ever taken part in a demonstration? Why?
- Do you think people should demonstrate more?
- Do you believe demonstrating is linked to violence?

RACISM D3

Interlocutor:

Now I'd like you to talk about something together for about 3 minutes.

The photos show different coloured people.

First, talk to each other about the photos. Describe what you see. Then decide if the colour of the skin or a religious background should affect your relationship with someone.

If candidates do not use all the time assigned for this task, the examiner may use these prompts to encourage further discussion.

- Would you change school or job if you had to share with a person from another ethnic origin?
- Why do you think people could be against people from other countries?
